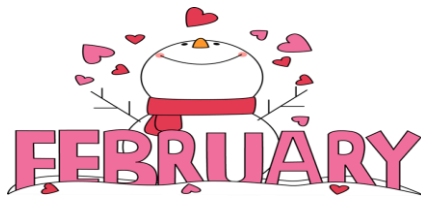

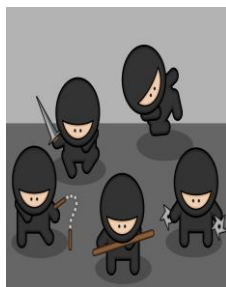

### Willing 2 Ninja

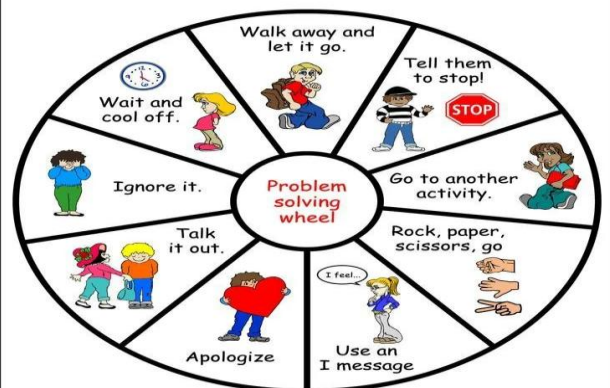
On Monday February 2<sup>nd</sup> and Tuesday February 3<sup>rd</sup>, our students get the chance to develop resiliency by participating in 2 days of Ninja obstacle course gym classes from visiting company Willing 2 Ninja. Students will jump, climb, balance, and push their bodies while having fun. We are also grateful to our PAC who help cover the cost of bringing this excellent activity to our school for our students.



### Conflict Resolution

Our Code of Conduct is on the school website and outlines expected behaviours at school. With 120 students and adults in our learning community, some conflict is inevitable, especially as students try to get what they want/need and are figuring out what is acceptable at school which may differ from home. If students have conflict, they should use a strategy from the Problem-Solving Wheel. If that doesn't work, they seek an adult whether it is in class or at Recess/Lunch. If the problem continues, reporting it to their teacher to help is the next step. Finally, if the problem persists, then it will be addressed by Mr. Ward at the Office if staff send it along, or parents call, email, or meet in person. We remind families when they are on school grounds, they can let a staff member know if issues are happening, rather than intervening.

### What can I do?



## **Cold Weather Clothing**

It is important that students dress for the weather when coming to school. During very poor weather students will be permitted to play appropriately inside. Given our surrounding topography, when temperatures are in the range of 0 to -10 degrees at the school, students are typically expected to play outside as long as the windchill isn't too bad. When the temperature drops below -10 degrees **at the school** there is a good chance students will have an indoor recess and/or lunch. The decision to have indoor recess/lunch rests with the Principal and is based on a number of factors (temperature at the school, windchill, shelters available, length of time outside, etc.). We ask that students arrive at school no earlier than 8:00am when supervision begins.



## **Extra Clothes**

It is a good idea for students to have a change of clothes in their backpacks for accidents that may happen at Recess and Lunch, or any other time of the day, so the school doesn't have to call home if other clothes are needed during the school day.



## **Kindergarten Registration**

## **Falkland Behaviour Reminders**

Some unsafe behaviours we've noticed and reminded students to stop, especially outside at Recess and Lunch are;

- Standing on the very high parts of playgrounds.
- Gun play and shooting type games or using skipping ropes inappropriately.
- Hands on pushing and wrestling (tag is alright).
- Standing on swings, instead of sitting.
- Doing things deliberately, often with hands-on, which harms others or wrecks/sabotages their fun.



### Pick Up and Drop Off

Student supervision starts at 8:00am and students are expected to enter and leave the school grounds by using one of the four openings in our chain linked fence. **Please DO NOT use the parking lot entrance at any time.** When parking your vehicle on school district property, please ensure you are not parking in non-designated parking spots. This includes; fire lanes, maintenance areas, bus loading/unloading areas, designated pick up and drop off areas, and areas where no parking signs are located. Please be mindful of your surroundings and watch for children & parents crossing the road.



### District Art Fair

Piccadilly Mall in Salmon Arm will be a colourful place February 6<sup>th</sup>-13<sup>th</sup> as students from throughout the district will have their artwork on display as part of the annual SD83 Elementary & Middle School District Art Fair!
