Student Wellness

This year, our parent-student and teacher Goal Setting Conferences take place from 8:15am-2:15pm (and possibly longer if staff make themselves available) on Monday, October 20th. Criminal Record Checks

A current and valid Criminal Record Check (CRC) is required to volunteer at our school. We are no longer accepting paper copies, but rather, Criminal Record Checks can be completed online with a link and code you can get from our school office if you'd like more information.

A CRC and Driver Information package are required to drive children, other than your own, to any school Events. This is an SD83 Policy that applies to all the schools in our District.



Book Fair

Our school is hosting a Scholastic Book Fair November 19-21. Students will be able to shop during their Library time on their Library Day. There will also be some Recess and Lunch times available for each grade. Parents can come in after school to shop during Book Fair week. Your investment in Literacy helps our whole school. All purchases earn rewards that can be redeemed for books and Education Resources for our school's library. Our PAC is looking for parent volunteers to help at the Book Fair, and those interested in helping can contact the Office for more information.

Individual Student Photo Day

Mountain West Photography will be taking individual photos for our Staff, Students and StrongStart participants on Tuesday, Oct 7 in the morning. Remind your child to bring their best smiles! Information will be sent home with students about how to order photos after photo day.

Student Fees

Fees were due September 30 and payment would be appreciated. If you are currently experiencing financial hardship and require support with the payment or partial payment of these school fees or supplies, please contact the Office.

Office Phone

A reminder that the phone in the office is for emergency calls only, not for making afterschool arrangements. After-school arrangements are to be made the day before, and students are not permitted to ride on buses they are not registered for in order to go to a friend's house. Miss Karlee may allow students to use the Office phone if deemed necessary by staff, and phone passes will be used during a natural break in the school day.

Messages can be delivered to students if families call the Office.

Medical Alerts

Families are also asked to fill in Consent Forms online and to update their email address with the Office if changes have been made. If students have allergies/medications that impact the school day, please make arrangements with the Office ASAP so we can keep students safe.

One-to-One Reading Program

We are always looking for amazing volunteers to join our ONE TO ONE Reading Program, which supports students at Falkland Elementary. Volunteers read with students, at least one day a week, during school hours. Literacy Alliance of the Shuswap Society will come to Falkland to do the training course required for volunteers if there is enough interest. Hallowe'en Safety

Some safety tips you may want to consider are:

- Most Halloween injuries are caused by falling; use of appropriate masks and costumes can prevent some injuries
- Masks and sunglasses narrow children's line of sight and can make it difficult to see obstacles. If your child is wearing a mask, make certain (s)he can see well and breathe easily
- Select brightly-coloured costumes that are fire resistant and attach reflective tape on areas or use glow-in-the-dark fabrics or fabric paint
- Dangling accessories can get snagged
- Don't allow your children to carry sharp objects, candles, or other dangerous accessories as part of their costume. Try to substitute alternative accessories for older children, and for younger children, encourage free hands
- Have children walk in familiar areas on a planned route. Equip them with glow sticks or flashlights
- Children should be warned to stop only at houses with lights on and should be instructed not to go inside any home without specific permission from parents



Head Lice

It is that time of year again; head lice are tiny insects that can live on human heads. They lay eggs (called nits) close to the scalp. Head lice do not spread disease, and they love washed or unwashed heads! Lice are very common among 3–12-year-olds.

Head Lice (Con't)

Scratching the head can be a sign of head lice, but kids can have them without any itching. You cannot prevent getting lice, but you can teach children not to share personal items they use on their heads (like brushes, and hats). Also, teach your child to put their hats and scarves in their coat sleeves at school. Be sure to braid or tie long hair back, and develop a routine of checking your child's head for lice at least once a week. Make sure to only treat for



head lice if you find live, moving lice on the head. Lots of other things can be mistaken for nits (head lice eggs) like dandruff and lint.
